

Thanksgiving, Christmas, Chanukah, Ramadan, Kwanza and New Year's Day can be a very difficult holidays for people who have experienced the death of a loved one.

Memories serve as constant reminders of loss. Watching others celebrate can be painful and overwhelming. Particularly in the first year after a death, survivors must learn how to develop new holiday rituals and traditions. The first step in coping with grief at the holidays is to acknowledge that the first holiday season is difficult. You can prepare for it by making specific plans and obtaining the support you need. Do not attempt to avoid the grief by keeping away from church and other events. Remember too, that sometimes anticipation of a holiday can be more difficult than the day itself.

Here are some recommendations for the holidays.

- ☑ Set realistic expectations for yourself.
- ☐ Surround yourself with people who love and support you.
- □ Despite the temptation, try to avoid "canceling" the holiday.
- ☑ Allow yourself to feel joy, sadness, anger – allow yourself to grieve.
- Do not feel guilty for grieving and mourning.
- Draw comfort from doing for others.
- ☑ Take care of yourself.
- ☑ Create a new tradition or ritual that accommodates your current situation.

You loved one died, you did not. Grief is real. It is never ending. One never overcomes it; one learns to live with it. You are not alone.

TBC Church Sponsor Senior Housing: The Scarborough


By Ray Nix, Nix Development Company The Scarborough, a new 84-unit affordable senior housing community by a strategic partnership between Trinity Baptist Church, National Church Residences, and Nix Development Company, has been awarded approximately \$9 million in Section 202 financing through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The development is slated to break ground in summer 2025. Trinity Baptist Church will lease their land to the partnership led by National Church Residences for the development of The Scarborough.



"The partnership with National Church Residences and Nix Development Company will ensure that the ministry footprint of Trinity Baptist Church reaches beyond the pews in this community.," said Dr. Victor M. Davis, pastor at Trinity Baptist Church. "Our vision for The Scarborough was to utilize the church's land to assist with the stabilization of our community and provide safe, modern, and affordable housing for our seniors."

Located directly across the street of Trinity Baptist Church on St. Clair Avenue on the historic near east side of Columbus, The Scarborough will be a professionally managed, independent living community for seniors age 62 and older. The mid-rise, fourstory building will be 100% affordable and consist of 76 one-bedroom and 8 twobedroom apartment homes. Resident amenities will include a large community room with a kitchen, an extensive fitness center and an outdoor gathering space.

In addition to the HUD award,
The Scarborough will combine
non-competitive 4% Housing
Tax Credits from the Ohio
Housing Finance Agency and
funds from the City of
Columbus.

The Harvest set will remain up until the end of November if anyone would like to take a selfie (smile).




